Regional Activity Center for Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP/RAC)



- Body of UNEP/MAP (Mediterranean Action Plan) under the Barcelona Convention for the Protection of the Mediterranean sea and its coastal region.
- Serves 21 riparian countries with FPs in every country.
- Also a Regional Center for capacity building of the Stockholm Convention on Persistent Organic Pollutants.

Marine litter and the Waste Management Hierarchy



The basis of the Prevention measures of the Regional Plan on ML relies on the application of the waste management hierarchy, both from **legislation for the management of urban solid waste** -including fiscal and economic measures to prevent generation-, and for *making the producers responsible for the entire life-cycle of the product (EPR) as well*, in order to encourage companies to design products less harmful for the environment, with long durability for reuse, apt for recycling and materials reduction in toxicity and weight.



Marine litter and the Waste Management Hierarchy



The EPR requires the implementation of a combination of measures such as:

★Regulatory instruments, e.g. eco-design requirements for products, bans for harmful substances (health and environment) and foster toxic chemicals substitution initiatives.

Conomic instruments: e.g. facilitating finance, including microfinance for sustainable products; charges on products (e.g. plastic packaging and bags); tax/fee differentiation according to environmental performance of products.

Communication instruments: e.g. eco-label programmes for products and services; guidelines on sustainable product design; consumer campaigns, guidelines for green purchasing

Capacity building for concerned stakeholders: training programmes on eco-design and eco-innovation for businesses, universities and financial agents

Voluntary/Procedural instruments: e.g. sectoral agreements and sustainability awards; environmental agreements with retailers; knowledge centers on sustainable product design; public-private partnerships and voluntary industry commitments on green corporate procurement.

(<u>SCP component only</u>) Non-single use of plastic bags and promotion of EPR

The objective is to promote at national level **the banning of the single-use plastic bags, and the reduction of plastics production and use in packaging and other main uses** (for sectors and services affecting/generating ML) **by**:

- Raising awareness of EPR measures to address prevention of ML to national, regional and local govs.
- To provide technical support to producers to introduce ecodesign and eco-innovation.

EU-UNEP/MAP project on ML: Activities (SCP component only)

- To undertake an assessment of national regulatory frameworks in some countries and develop where appropriate the required legal and regulatory framework to introduce the non-single use of plastic bags and EPR for plastic bags
- To organize national meetings to raise awareness on prevention of ML and the need to promote EPR with regards to plastic and microplastic production and consumption as well as circular economy
- To organize a regional/subregional workshop to share best practices addressing EPR and non-single use of plastic bags based on Mediterranean experiences
- Specific Guidelines and training material to prevent the generation of plastics and wastes ending up as ML.



- The activity would contribute to promote in the Mediterranean countries the links and complementarities between the EU Marine Strategy Framework Directive (MSFD) and the EC Circular Economy Package.
- The activity will be disseminated through the SwitchMed Programme website (switchmed.eu), which includes the SCP action network with more than 1,000 members and multistakeholders events like the SwitchMed connect, bringing together about 400 stakeholders from Mediterranean countries.


